

Key References:

Luke 15:1-3 (ESV)

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them." ³ So he told them this parable:

Luke 15:5-7 (ESV)

⁵ And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. ⁶ And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.'
⁷ Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

Luke 15:8 (ESV)

⁸ "Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp and sweep the house and seek diligently until she finds it?

Luke 15:11-13 (ESV)

¹¹ And he said, "There was a man who had two sons. ¹² And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them. ¹³ Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living.

Luke 15:22 (ESV)

²² But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet.

Luke 15:31-32 (ESV)

³¹ And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. ³² It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.' "

After talking about distraction Terry reminded us that the primary purpose God has us here is: "to see lost people come to salvation, dead people be made alive in Christ." **Do you feel that this is your primary purpose?**

Read Luke 15:1-3. Terry reminded us that Jesus directed the following parables to "organized religion" and not the sinners. Why did Jesus switch from one crowd to the other and why is this important to understand?

1 - Searching for the lost

Read Luke 15:4-7. How do you think Jesus wanted the Pharisees to respond to this? How does he want us to respond to it?

Read verses 5-7 again. How should this joy dictate our priorities?

2 - The value of the lost

Terry used an illustration of a \$50 note in different locations and said; "If something is out of position or lost it's value does not diminish before God." What did this make you think about?

Read Luke 15:8-10. If reaching the lost isn't a priority are devaluing them?

3 – A son's identity

Read Luke 15:11-19. Why did the son want to enter back into his father's household as a servant?

Read on to Luke 20-24. What is the significance of the father rushing to get the robe, the ring and shoes for his son? What do these 3 things represent for us in God's household?

Terry said "There are no servants in the household of God waiting to be made sons. When we come home, we come home." Have you ever felt that you can't do the work of God because you are not worthy of it? Why is that feeling so wrong?

4 – The second brother

Read the rest of the parable, Luke 15:25-32. The second son didn't see the value of his brother's return. **Why did he miss it?**

The older brother might have taken the brother as a servant. How can we be filled with God's supernatural grace like the father? Why do we need God's supernatural grace to reach the lost?
