Colossians 2:16-23 (ESV)

¹⁶ Therefore let no one pass judgment on you in questions of food and drink, or with regard to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath.
¹⁷ These are a shadow of the things to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. ¹⁸ Let no one disqualify you, insisting on asceticism and worship of angels, going on in detail about visions, puffed up without reason by his sensuous mind, ¹⁹ and not holding fast to the Head, from whom the whole body, nourished and knit together through its joints and ligaments, grows with a growth that is from God.

²⁰ If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the world, why, as if you were still alive in the world, do you submit to regulations— ²¹ "Do not handle, Do not taste, Do not touch"
²² (referring to things that all perish as they are used)—according to human precepts and teachings? ²³ These have indeed an appearance of wisdom in promoting self-made religion and asceticism and severity to the body, but they are of no value in stopping the indulgence of the flesh.

Colossians 2:13–14 (ESV)

¹³ And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.

1 – DIY Religion

One of the books Mark found at Chapters was called; "A Religion Of One's Own: A Guide To Creating A Personal Spirituality In A Secular World." Do you think we're living in an age of DIY or designer-religion? What expressions of DIY religion do we see?

2 - Ecstatic Experiences

Read Colossians 2:16-17. What things was these people being pressured into? Why don't Christians observe Jewish traditions?

Read Colossians 2:18-19. Of the four things listed in v18 how do they miss the point of the gospel?

Mark used the phrase "ecstatic experiences" to group these things. Can you think of four things like these that could creep into modern-day Christianity? Why should we be weary of ecstatic experiences?

3 - Rigid Rules Can't Bring Life

Mark talked about "rigid rules," what are some "rules" that you have been taught that you believe are religious?

Read Colossians 2:20-22. What kinds of regulations hinted at in v21 is the writer getting at here?

Read Colossians 2:23. Why do these things promote a self-made religion? How are they unwise?

Why is this white-knuckled approach and rigid rules "of no value in stopping the indulgence of the flesh?"

4 - Relationship

Mark said; "rules bring death, but a relationship with Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit brings life." Why is this relationship more powerful than any rule?

Have you found yourself implementing rules in your life in-place of a real relationship with Jesus? Why do we have a tendency to do this?

What have you found recently that has brought new life to your relationship with Jesus?
