#### 2 Corinthians 9:6-11 (NIV)

<sup>6</sup> Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. <sup>7</sup> Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. <sup>8</sup> And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. <sup>9</sup> As it is written:

"They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; their righteousness endures forever."

<sup>10</sup> Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. <sup>11</sup> You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.

### Matthew 23:23 (NLT)

<sup>23</sup> "What sorrow awaits you teachers of religious law and you Pharisees. Hypocrites! For you are careful to tithe even the tiniest income from your herb gardens, but you ignore the more important aspects of the law—justice, mercy, and faith. You should tithe, yes, but do not neglect the more important things.

#### 1 – GENEROSITY STARTS WITH GRATITUDE

Would you describe yourself as a grateful person? What is the amount of gratefulness in someone's life based on?

Who is the most generous person you have ever know? Why were they like that?

Read the quote from Paul. How does gratefulness start and continue to feed generosity in someone's life? Can someone be generous without being grateful first?

Paul said gratefulness needs to be felt daily. What can you set your focus on every day to bring gratefulness to the surface? In what way is being grateful a spiritual discipline?

#### 2 - THE PURPOSE OF GENEROSITY

Paul said the purpose of God's blessings is for the extension of His kingdom. **What did he mean?** 

Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-11. What is the purpose of God's blessing and then giving found in verse 11? What else speaks to you from this scripture?

#### 3 - GIVING BACK TO GOD

Read Matthew 23:23. What was Jesus' view on tithing? What is the purpose of tithing? What do you find difficult about giving to the church? What does giving back to God do in our hearts?

#### 4 - PREPARING TO BE GENEROUS

Paul shared how he and Katie set aside money to be generous with. How were you encouraged by this? What other ways can you prepare in-advance to make being generous easier?

#### 5 - GIVING CHEERFULLY

Paul linked being prepared to give to increased joy in giving. **Why should giving and joy go hand in hand?**
