Matthew 5:38-42 (NLT)

³⁸ "You have heard the law that says the punishment must match the injury: 'An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth.' ³⁹ But I say, do not resist an evil person! If someone slaps you on the right cheek, offer the other cheek also. ⁴⁰ If you are sued in court and your shirt is taken from you, give your coat, too. ⁴¹ If a soldier demands that you carry his gear for a mile, carry it two miles. ⁴² Give to those who ask, and don't turn away from those who want to borrow.

Luke 21:1-4 (NLT)

While Jesus was in the Temple, he watched the rich people dropping their gifts in the collection box. ² Then a poor widow came by and dropped in two small coins. ³ "I tell you the truth," Jesus said, "this poor widow has given more than all the rest of them. ⁴ For they have given a tiny part of their surplus, but she, poor as she is, has given everything she has."

Luke 7:36-48 (NLT) - Jesus anointed by a sinful woman

John 10:17-18 (NLT)

¹⁷ "The Father loves me because I sacrifice my life so I may take it back again. ¹⁸ No one can take my life from me. I sacrifice it voluntarily. For I have the authority to lay it down when I want to and also to take it up again. For this is what my Father has commanded."

1 - PERCIEVING LACK

What is the area of lack in your life that you think about most often? It could be time, emotion, skillset, wealth...

Wes began by saying: "We can lack as the biggest thing in our lives. It's can become the lens that we perceive everything around us." Are you in a season of being overwhelmed by your lack? What happens to us when lack becomes our lens of perception?

2 - THE OTHER CHEEK

Read Matthew 5:38-42. Thinking of Jesus' audience how is verse 41 particularly challenging? What do you think would be a modern-day equivalent of the cheek, the coat and the soldier's gear? Why doesn't Jesus tell his audience to stand up for their rights?

3 - SUNDAY STORIES

Wes shared two stories from his family (parents wedding rings & his cheque / mission trip) and Steve shared about God saving their fish farm. From these 3 stories; can you think of 3 important lessons that we need to reinforce? Do any of these 3 stories remind you of a testimony of your own?

4 - SURRENDERING BEFORE JESUS

Read Luke 7:36-48. How does knowing what Jesus has done for us lead us to live and give of ourselves sacrificially? Can you remember a time where Jesus brought you to surrender like the woman in this story?

How does knowing the weight of what Jesus has done for us take our focus away from what we lack? What opportunities arise out of a life that is focused in that direction?
