¹² Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, ¹³ for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

1 John 1:2–3 (ESV)

² the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us— ³ that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.

Ephesians 3:17–19 (ESV)

¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Ephesians 1:17–18 (ESV)

¹⁷ that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, ¹⁸ having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, [...]

1 – WHAT HAVE YOU SEEN AND HEARD?

At the beginning of Ken’s message, he shared stories about when he was a new believer. Stories of a lame boy walking and a demonic spirit being cast out of a teenage girl. Without any deep theological knowledge God brought people to salvation when Ken shared what he had simply heard and seen God do in those early years. **Why is sharing our firsthand experiences of God so impactful? What did you think about those stories?**

Read 1 John 1:2-3. **How is simply sharing what you’ve personally seen and heard a refreshingly simple way of sharing the Gospel? What are you going to stories of God working?**

2 – FRESH REVELATION

Ken talked at length about our need for ongoing and fresh revelation from Christ. **What happens in a Christian’s life when we stop getting fresh revelation?**

Ken said, *“If I don’t receive ongoing revelation, then what happens is I begin to stagnate or I begin to try and work my own salvation out and I put low on myself. I get legalistic and it’s about doing instead of being.”* **How does that resonate with you?**

Ken mentioned 4 things that facilitate revelation. **Do you remember what they were?** They were: hunger, desire, desperateness and intimacy. **Discuss at length why each of these things facilitate fresh revelation.**

On Sunday Ken said, *“Jesus called us through intimacy not through doctrine and facts.”* **Are you in a season of having intimacy with Christ?**

Read Ephesians 3:17-19. **How can we know something that “surpasses knowledge?”**

3 – REPENTANCE, EQUIPPING + ENGAGEMENT

What link did Ken make between fresh revelation and repentance? Ken said repentance needed to be an ongoing process in our lives. **Why did he say this?**

After talking about revelation and repentance why did Ken finish with tying that into equipping and engagement. **Did anything stand out to you there?**
